

# Report on the use of Sports Premium

<p><b>Overview of Sports Premium</b></p>	<p>The Sports Premium is additional funding given to schools to improve physical education (PE). The funding is allocated directly to schools with pupils of primary age. Schools can choose how they use the funding, for example:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>-hire specialist PE Teachers or qualified sports coaches to work with teachers during PE lessons</li> <li>-provide resources for PE</li> <li>-run sports competitions or increase pupils' participation in the School Games</li> </ul>
<p><b>How are we accountable?</b></p>	<p>The new Ofsted Framework published in September 2019 require schools to report on PE and sport provision and on how schools spend their additional funding. They are also to analyse the impact of the spending of this funding.</p>
<p><b>Looking back: How the previous year's allocation was spent?</b> 2019-20</p>	<p>In 2019-20 the school received <b>£17100</b> and this was allocated towards:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Clubbercise provision (£4000). Every student on the Yellow pathway in KS2 and above will benefit from dance and fitness provision in the year.</li> <li>• Yoga provision for all students on the Green and Yellow pathways in KS1 and Lower KS2 (£3500)</li> <li>• Swimming sessions (£4000)</li> <li>• Cover for staff for Rebound &amp; Hydrotherapy Sessions, purchase of specialist rebound therapy resources (£2600)</li> <li>• Riding for the Disabled provision (£3000)</li> </ul>
<p><b>What was the impact of this funding?</b></p>	<p>Much of the evidence of the impact of Sports Premium can be found in pupils observations from their EHCP's, therapy reports, Behaviour Plans and sensory diet information. Individual pupils assessments can also be used to measure impact.</p> <p>The evidences include:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Pupils benefit from enhanced resources</li> <li>• Pupils benefit from enhanced opportunities to interact with their peers at playtimes. Facilitated communication using rebound and hydrotherapy as a tool</li> <li>• Pupils have an activity that can lower heightened sensory stimuli</li> <li>• Pupils have an option to lower heightened anxiety that may otherwise lead to challenging behaviour</li> </ul>
<p><b>Total amount allocated for the current academic year.</b> 2020 - 21</p>	<p>In 2020 - 21 the school is likely to receive <b>£.16,480</b> sports premium to benefit all primary aged pupils.</p>
<p><b>Looking forward: What are our plans to spend the sports premium this academic year?</b> 2019 - 20</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• We are using this academic years funding to pay for Clubbercise provision (£4000). Every student on the Yellow pathway in KS2 and above will benefit from dance and fitness provision in the year.</li> <li>• Yoga provision for all students on the Green and Yellow pathways in KS1 and KS2 (£3500)</li> <li>• Swimming sessions (£4000)</li> <li>• Cover for staff for Rebound &amp; Hydrotherapy Sessions (£2600)</li> <li>• Riding for the Disabled provision (£2380)</li> </ul>
